Griot recently received a generous donation of the 12,000 square foot historic Paramount Theater on Yazoo Avenue in downtown Clarksdale and the adjoining (former JC Penny) 3-story, 21,000 square foot building. They will provide a state-of-the-art home for our expanded arts programs including a full-scale dance program, music program, and community theater. The theater will also serve as a space for performances, lectures, films, concerts, festivals, events, and our expanded Meraki Coffee Roastery and Cafe. Bringing new life to downtown Clarksdale, the new buildings will be a gathering space for the whole community to share in the cultural richness of the Mississippi Delta.

In order to adequately prepare for Griot Arts to move our programming to this new building, we have created a 3-5 year strategic plan to expand current programming, hire new administrative and program staff, and create more robust partnerships with local and regional institutions. This plan also includes strategy to engage new funders and to grow a capital campaign. 
